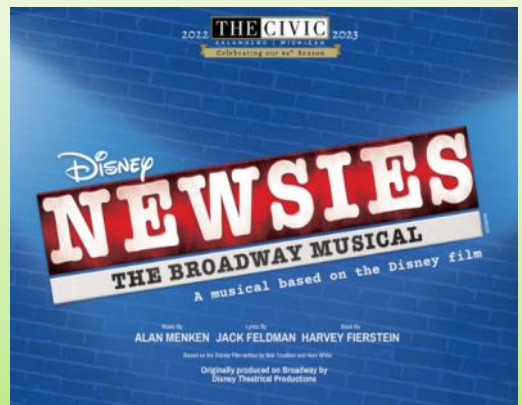

# CHURCH, as summer merges into fall...

**Worship will continue, in person and live-streamed.** After some discussion at our Session meeting last evening we have decided to modify our Pandemic precautions at Westminster.

1. If you are fully vaccinated, you are not required to wear a mask while in the facility (including during Worship). Masks are optional—but of course, if you feel more comfortable wearing one, then please do so.
2. If you are unvaccinated, we request that you continue to wear a mask while at Westminster.
3. If you have had a significant recent exposure to someone with covid, please wear a mask.
4. If you have symptoms of Covid (sniffles, cough, fever, etc), please stay home, worship virtually, get a covid test and get better quickly!

We will continue to have masks available at church. We will continue to open the doors and run the fans as usual. If you would like to socially distance during worship, please feel free to do so (again, this is optional for the fully vaccinated). **Coffee Plus** will continue outdoors as weather permits. (We can still use some more help to be able to offer it every Sunday).

## **WORSHIP SPACE NEWS...**

Our sanctuary carpet project is complete! Big thanks to all who helped put away chairs after the services and to those who helped replace all the furniture into the sanctuary. Many hands made light work. The process went smoothly thanks to Jim Gluys (carpet) and Chris Rohwer's (hearing loop) coordination with the contractors.

Before the new carpet was put in place, we installed a Hearing Loop system to allow users with a T-coil hearing aid to listen to the service directly from the sound system into their hearing aids. If you have a hearing aid that has a T-coil, talk with Kelly Schultz or Joyce Thorsen about turning it on so that you can hear the service better.

As usual, having something new in place helps us notice things that might need updating. Look for some more projects happening in the next year.

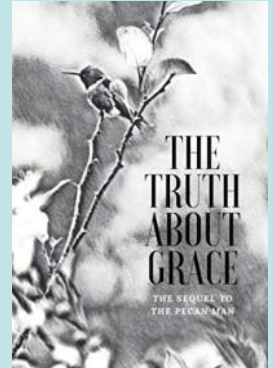

# WESTMINSTER PEACE PRIZE

## 2022 Peace Prize Recipient

Westminster Presbyterian Church is very pleased to announce that Housing Resources, Inc. will be the recipient of the 2022 Peace Prize. Gaylin Barnum, Outreach Director, is planning to attend our October 30 service.

The purpose of the Westminster Presbyterian Church Peace Prize is to recognize an individual, couple or group that has gone above and beyond to create world peace with a project, ongoing service or other manner. This is someone or a group that is in the community, state, nation or world. The intent for the prize is to look outside of the congregation in order to connect WPC to others. The peace prize is an annual recognition where the recipient(s) is asked to be honored during a church service in October. The name of the recipient is placed on a plaque that is kept at church, and the recipient receives a portion of the funds collected in the Peace Offering to further their initiative.

Housing Resources, Inc. helps economically or socially disadvantaged people acquire and maintain permanent, affordable, safe housing; assists with rent or mortgages; helps stabilize housing for homeless families or those in danger of losing housing; and, in emergencies, directs homeless people to overnight lodging. Currently homelessness and housing insecurity and instability is at an alarmingly high level – the highest in our history.

**40% of our Peace Offering will be donated to Housing Resources, Inc., so please consider donating generously!**

## FROM THE PASTORS' DESK

Since we don't have any musings from the Pastors this month, I was asked to report on the experience of our Racial Equity Small Group. As you may be aware, we have been meeting fairly regularly since June of 2020 (shortly after George Floyd's death). We started on Zoom (because everything happened on Zoom at that point in time!) just talking about what was going on in our country and then broadening the discussion to consider the historical context of America's racial issues.

We read lots of books, separately and together: *The Book of Forgiving* by Desmond and Mpho Tutu (in early 2020, even before the pandemic); *The Bluest Eye* by Toni Morrison; *White Fragility* by Robin Diangelo; *The Underground Railroad* by Colton Whitehead; *The Color of Compromise* by Jemar Tisby. This last one was a real eye-opener for me. Tisby, writing as a PhD student in Mississippi, documented the complicity of the American church in slavery and racism throughout America's history. I was shocked and saddened how time after time after time, Christians in America made choices that led to further oppression of blacks; sometimes for financial reasons, sometimes because of hate. I was reminded again and again and again how "things could have been different" today if our ancestors had made different choices at these critical forks in the road. I saw how the Bible was used as justification for oppression, used "as a stone and not as bread".

We watched movies ("*13th*" by Ava Duvernay) and listened to preachers like the Reverend William Barber, head of The Poor People's Campaign. We heard from a Lansing-area pastor, Reverend Stanley Jenkins, who visited with us in June 2022. He described in great detail his congregation's efforts to engage with a nearby Black church in an effort to lessen the divide, learn from each other and live more closely as brothers and sisters in Christ.

And in July 2022, we recited a "Litany of Repentance", a proclamation presented at the recent General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (see below)—a powerful prayer.

And we hosted a Racial Equity Sunday Service in January 2022 (near MLK day) to share our experiences with all of you.

All of these efforts were designed to simply teach us about American history from a viewpoint that we don't live: the viewpoint of people of color in America. Public policy has favored the white population in a thousand small ways; the American history we were taught in school doesn't cover everything that really happened (including the Tulsa Massacre, which I honestly had never heard of until 2020—an unbelievable crime for which no one was ever held accountable).

I recently read "*To Kill a Mockingbird*" by Harper Lee for the first time (I know, how did I miss



this?). I'm reminded of how Atticus Finch, a lawyer in Maycomb, a small town in Alabama in the 1950's, gave his daughter Scout a crucial piece of moral advice:

"You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view — until you climb into his skin and walk around in it."

And I guess that's what the past two years have been about for me: considering things from other people's points of view. May God give us wisdom as we seek solutions to the problems in our community and help us to listen to others who have lived different realities.

## **The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA)**

**A LITANY OF REPENTANCE:** As white Christians we repent of our complicity in the belief in white supremacy: the belief that people of European descent are superior in intelligence, skills, imagination, and perseverance. We acknowledge that this belief in white supremacy has been the foundation of, and an excuse for, atrocities against people of African descent in the United States and in the world.

We repent of our failure to recognize and take responsibility for the legacy of slavery.

We repent of the injustice, pain, humiliation, and suffering imposed on African Americans by our ancestors and ourselves through actions and inaction. We repent of our complicity in failing to act in mutual loving relationship.

We repent of closing our eyes to the degradation and injustice forced upon African Americans who were enslaved, segregated, terrorized, and imprisoned.

We repent of covering our ears to the crying of families torn apart, to the sound of human flesh being struck, while songs of freedom and heavenly grace flow from our lips.

We repent that we have failed as an institution and as individuals to use our voices to abhor and end lynching, segregation, and racial profiling. We regret our generations of silence on these issues so that we could maintain a comfortable life in our churches, homes, and communities.

We repent of shutting our hearts to the experiences of fellow humans whose stories of pain, suffering, hardship, struggle, love, and joy mirror our own life journeys, yet are deprived of privilege and marred by racism. We have turned our backs and walked away pretending not to see, yet we saw, pretending not to know, yet we knew, and convincing ourselves that we were not complicit, yet we are.

We now know that we as white Christians have benefitted directly and indirectly from these injustices. We name ourselves as complicit and repent.

Finally, we repent of our violent actions to suppress Black agency. African Americans, since the time of slavery, have actively pursued their freedom ... built this country ... laid foundational structures ... and demonstrated their capacity to fully participate in the construction of this American society in spite of white supremacy.

As repentance means turning and going the other way, with Christ's help we seek to do so. At the same time, we commit ourselves to walking with people of African descent toward the goal of healing, reconciliation, and eliminating racism as we seek to dismantle white privilege.

### **Watercolor Painting Returns with Kay Severson!**

Come experience the many facets of watercolor painting. It is an exciting medium, full of surprises for the artist.

**Basic:** During these hands-on-classes, you will have the opportunity to experiment with a variety of both conventional and unconventional tools, techniques, and material while exploring the basic elements of works of Art: shape, value, color, and texture. The class starts with an exploration of watercolor painting material, from paint, paper, and brushes to erasers, pencils, palettes and more; brands to look for and those to avoid, and where to find them for the best price. We have two weeks to collect the material we want to use. The average cost for material is about \$40.

**It is strongly suggested that students take "Basic" classes before "Practice" classes.**

**Practice:** In this series of classes, we will use the concepts presented in the Basic class to create unique, personal pieces of Seascape art from open water, sun and clouds, to boats, piers, water plants, and animals. Together we'll reflect silently on a scripture passage, poem, or image using the practice of lectio divina. What word, phrase, or detail of the image draws your attention? What images or memories do you associate with that part? Do you sense an invitation for more attention, action, or reflection? After an additional 3 minutes of resting in silence together, each participant may share their experience without interruption or comment from the group. Each week is a separate experience so come when you can. Join us for this age-old practice.

Each month in the coming year we will invite everyone to focus on **One Word**. It will be our congregation-wide Star Gift for the month. ## God's House / Our House...WPC Building & Grounds Update

Building & Grounds continues to plug away at facility maintenance needs and upgrades:

- Installed new faucets in Narthex kitchenette and both restrooms adjacent to Church offices.
- Fellowship Hall activity:
  - ◇ Secured the "chair rail" (at nine feet from ground) along the walls in several locations
  - ◇ Power-scrubbed the vinyl wallpaper to remove dirt and grime
  - ◇ Remounted several fallen fabric-covered noise deadening panels
  - ◇ Repaired urinal in men's room
  - ◇ Replaced the water softener after 20+ year-old softener stopped working
  - ◇ Acquired two new 45 gallon roller-cart trash cans
- Replaced insulation on cooling line for basement air conditioner
- Assisted in the removal and replacement of the Sanctuary carpet; Surplus carpet was set aside for future use.
- Pruned low hanging branches in yard to improve access for lawn mowing service
- Performed string trimming in various areas of parking lot
- Performed preliminary cleaning of boiler room drain. Drain will require additional cleaning actions and possibly will need replacement. There is no longer a leak issue in boiler room, however, the drain supports the removal of combustion condensation from the high efficiency boilers that heat the main building.

The Building & Grounds Team continues working to provide a safe, welcoming **Space** while being good stewards of money and the environment.

## **Update on the Salarzai Family**

from First Presbyterian's Refugee Resettlement Team

Noor Zamin (father) has been working full time at Summit Polymers since March. Jamila (mother) gave birth to a healthy boy in May while caring for her other five children. The children have been attending the English Second Language program at Kalamazoo Public Schools and just finished their summer school session.

First Presbyterian has provided weekly English lessons, secured regular access to food, and walked with the family through a pregnancy, several surgeries and ongoing medical and dental treatment. Drivers from First Presbyterian and Westminster provide transportation for the family. Others have introduced the family to financial practices including banking and financial planning.

Stable housing has been a challenge. Due to the affordable housing shortage, especially for a family of eight, and their brief financial history here in the United States, the family has lived temporarily in a condo whose lease expired August 15<sup>th</sup>. By God's grace, an opportunity and means to purchase a house in a welcoming, diverse neighborhood was provided.

First Presbyterian assisted with the cost of necessary repairs and purchases for the house (new stove, new beds, asbestos removal, essential plumbing updates and a new water heater). The Sherrif-Goslin Roofing Company installed a new roof at their cost without profit to support this ministry. The roof was replaced on August 11<sup>th</sup> and the family moved into their new home on August 13<sup>th</sup>.
