Sometimes they pretend to be a person or organization you know and trust. This is a gentle reminder to please be very discerning about what you click on or respond to and very careful about sharing any information, especially financial or contact information, over the phone or in email.

Please know that no member of Westminster's staff or other church leader will ever ask you to send them cash, transfer funds to their account, or mail them gift cards. Any donation request from your church will invite you to send or bring a check (made to WPC) to the church. It will never be an urgent emergency requiring instant response; you can always call the church office for more info. Also, we will not give your contact information to groups or individuals outside the church and "refer" them to you.

If you have general questions or concerns about this, or about any church-related communication, please call the church office; we will do what we can to assist you.

SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION

In **February**, we continue the study of the book *Being Presbyterian in a Dysvangelical America*, by Ted Foote and P. Alec Thornburg.

Ann and Francis Cirvencic are leading the discussion about this book which investigates the interaction between evangelical and Presbyterian beliefs and how each set affects our culture.

You do not have to read the book to join the discussion.

This class will meet February 1st and 8th and will conclude on the 15th.

Sunday mornings during **LENT**, we will read, reflect on, and maybe even be inspired by short essays from readers of *The Christian Century*. This magazine regularly offers a one-word prompt (such as *promise* or *gravity*), then publishes a small collection of the responses, which tell personal stories and reflect on insights, struggles, and questions of faith. 





FROM THE PASTORS' DESK

A lot of folks have been asking Janet and me what we plan to do in retirement. I've not really known what the right answer is to that question except to say that we have plenty of interests and options. But the truth is that we don't really know, and... there's so much holding our attention in the present. I'm excited about the Lenten sermon series coming up, working with the confirmation class on faith statements, another Easter season, and the forthcoming Art Festival. It seems too soon to be "planning retirement."

Several years ago, we attended a Post-Easter retreat at Ghost Ranch in New Mexico. It was intended to provide a time of rest for clergy after a busy Lenten season, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday. Meals were scheduled but everything else was very flexible. I remember one pastor (just retired) who said that he would probably spend most of the time sleeping. And he did!

Who hasn't thought how much could be accomplished if we didn't have to sleep? In fact, most pastors have experienced lost sleep at some point in their ministries: worrying about a parishioner, upset over a conflict, or just struggling to meet the "inevitable return of Sunday." Johnathon Bennett offers up an essay in the January 2024 issue of *The Christian Century* on "sleep." In it he points out that sleep belongs to our DNA, that we need it to function in a healthy manner. During a moment of sleeplessness, he writes: "I don't want anything more than what I, at that moment, cannot have. I want nothing else than to lie down like every other creature and give up those hours to vulnerability and motionlessness. To surrender just a few moments and admit that all the other minutes in the day are enough" (p.55).

Not only does our need for sleep give perspective for our waking hours, it makes us more effective during those hours, argues Roger Talbott in the next essay of the same issue. Unlike our daydreams, he writes, "The dreams that arise

in the night... steer me through ever-changing circumstances. They are brutally honest about my faults. Ye they also offer compassionate encouragement in my journey toward wholeness" (p.55).

I don't know what retirement will look like, but I do know that it won't mean abandoning the "journey toward wholeness" that we've been walking with you for these many years. When that day comes we will begin walking a different path from the church; but the goal for all of us will remain the same.

We will all need to tend the dreams of our sleep, to listen to God's leading. It will be tempting to busy ourselves with all that needs to be done. Transitions are like that; but long journeys are best begun after a good night's rest. That's true for our present ministry together and our future ministries beyond.

FEBRUARY is PER CAPITA MONTH. The Presbyterian Church (USA) is a connectional church, which means that our congregation is part of the Presbytery of Lake Michigan, which is part of the Synod of the Covenant, which is part of the whole denomination. We support the work of the church at these different levels through per capita apportionments, to share costs fairly with each church's portion based on its number of members. Per capita funds support all kinds of things: preparing people for ministry, helping churches find pastors and pastors find churches, ecumenical relations, worship resources, leadership training, ... and much more.

For 2026, the per capita (per member) amount is \$42.42. Many church members like to cover this amount for themselves and/or their family members, as a special offering in addition to their pledges. The Finance Team encourages all of our members to consider this. It helps our church fulfill this important commitment AND it says that we are grateful to be Presbyterian! 


FEBRUARY FILM STUDY: Every Monday evening

Equal Exchange Pecans from African American Farmers

Westminster has a display of Equal Exchange foods that are for sale in the narthex. To purchase, place cash or a check made out to Westminster in an envelope and put in the black box in the copy room. To learn more about New Communities, check out the full article on the bulletin board beside the food.

Our congregation offers Equal Exchange pecans sourced from New Communities, Inc., an organization based in Albany, Georgia. Co-founded in 1969 by activists Shirley Sherrod and her husband, Baptist Minister Charles Sherrod, New Communities is a grassroots organization working to empower African American families in Southwest Georgia and to advocate for social justice. The Sherrods actively advocated for the rights of African Americans during the civil rights movement and beyond.

New Communities has a unique structure. It's a land trust, in which the community has control of the land. In New Communities' case, African American farmers own their land, work together, share resources, and are able to farm successfully. When you purchase Equal Exchange pecans from New Communities, you will enjoy large and savory pecans while supporting African American farmers, civil rights, and community development.

The WPC Racial Equity Group continues to meet monthly. We value learning and growing to respect all people; especially those of color who have been discriminated against on a regular basis.

On January 11, 2026, we hosted a screening of the film "My Father's Name". This powerful documentary short film tells the story of a woman who discovers that her father participated in a lynching, and the personal journey she takes to grapple with this revelation. We had approximately 40 people in attendance.

At our next meeting we will gather at church and discuss the book by James Baldwin *The Fire Next Time*. Everyone is welcome to attend and you do not need to have read the book to join us. We hope you will come.


